MISSION STATEMENT

Manchester University respects the infinite worth of every individual and graduates persons of ability and conviction who draw upon their education and faith to lead principled, productive, and compassionate lives that improve the human condition.

HISTORY

Manchester University, founded in 1889, is an independent university of the Church of the Brethren. In 2023-2024, 1,175 students from 26 states and five countries studied here.

Manchester University traces its origins to the Roanoke (Ind.) Classical Seminary founded by the United Brethren Church in 1860. The Seminary became Manchester College in 1889, when the school was moved to North Manchester. In 1895, members of the Church of the Brethren purchased the campus and this affiliation continues. Mount Morris College (Ill.) merged with Manchester College in 1932. Manchester welcomes students of all faiths and celebrates its relationship with the Church of the Brethren.

On July 1, 2012, Manchester College became Manchester University and, in fall 2012, students began studying at Manchester University Fort Wayne, home of the Pharmacy, Pharmacogenomics, Nutrition and Nutrigenomics, Nursing, Physical Therapy and Athletic Training Programs.

Manchester has been fully accredited since 1932 by the Higher Learning Commission of the North Central Association of Colleges and Schools. The Teacher Education Program is accredited by the Indiana Professional Standards Board and the National Council for the Accreditation of Teacher Education. The Social Work Program is accredited by the Council on Social Work Education. The Athletic Training Program is accredited by the Commission on Accreditation of Athletic Training Education. The Doctor of Pharmacy Program is accredited by the Accreditation Council for Pharmacy Education. The Nursing Program is accredited by the Commission on Collegiate Nursing Education. The Nutrition and Nutrigenomics Program has been granted Candidate status by the Accreditation Council for Education in Nutrition and Dietetics of the Academy of Nutrition and Dietetics. The Doctor of Physical Therapy Program has been granted Candidate for Accreditation status by the Commission on Accreditation in Physical Therapy Education.

VALUES STATEMENT

As a community of higher education rooted in the liberal arts and the traditions of the Church of the Brethren, Manchester University values:

- **Learning**, because high academic expectations in an environment combining liberal arts and professional preparation equip graduates to live healthy, productive and principled lives;

TRADITIONS

Each year, immediately following commencement ceremonies, our new graduates receive a small oak tree from the Alumni Association. An iconic symbol of the University, the oak represents the University's hope for our graduates – that they be strong, resilient and awe-inspiring, and that they rely on their deep roots to thrive.

Starting a new tradition this year, Manchester colleagues have been invited by the president to present diplomas to graduating family members.

Only graduates of Manchester walk between the pillars under the Manchester Chime tower bells. After the ceremony our graduates will take their first trip through the pillars.



Academic Ceremonies and Regalia

Academic dress, inspired centuries ago in Europe, has evolved in the United States since colonial times. Today most colleges and universities, including Manchester, observe the academic dress code of the American Council on Education.

A scholar's highest degree determines the robe. Gowns for the master's and doctoral degrees are usually ankle length and, for bachelor's and master's degrees, untrimmed. A doctor's degree gown is more elaborate, with velvet facing and three velvet bars on full, bell-shaped sleeves.

Mortarboards are the standard headwear except for persons with doctorates who may chose a soft, rounded tam. Hoods, once worn on the head for warmth, are now draped over the shoulders and are longer for doctors than for masters.

Colors help tell the story. The color of the hood lining indicates the university where the graduate degree was earned. The color of the hood trim, satin for masters and velvet for doctorates, identifies the scholar's field. For those with doctorates, the velvet facing and bars of the gown may be black or the color of the academic discipline. Once only black, the gown itself can now be in the color of the university awarding the degree.

Pharmacy Graduation with Distinction

Students graduating with Latin honors wear gold cords draped around the neck. To graduate with distinction, a candidate for the Doctor of Pharmacy degree must have completed a minimum of 144

semester hours and accumulated a GPA at or above 3.5. There are three levels of graduation with honors: *summa cum laude* (with highest honors) requires a GPA of 3.90 to 4.00; *magna cum laude* (with high honors) requires a GPA of 3.70 to 3.89; and *cum laude* (with honors) requires a GPA of 3.5 to 3.69.

Undergraduate Graduation with Distinction

Students graduating with Latin honors wear gold cords. *Summa cum laude* (with highest honors) requires a grade point average of 3.950 to 4.000; *magna cum laude* (with high honors) requires a GPA of 3.850 to 3.949; and *cum laude* (with honors) requires a GPA of 3.650 to 3.849. At least 90 semester hours in residence at MU are required for a baccalaureate degree.

Undergraduate Honors Recognition

There are three levels of Honors recognition. **Honors and Achievement** requires a student to achieve a cumulative 3.5 GPA and complete at least 18 hours of honors coursework – 9 hours outside of the major, 6 hours in the major, and 3 hours of IDIV 495. Graduates wear an Honors Program graduate medallion engraved with the University crest. **Honors** requires a student to achieve a cumulative 3.5 GPA and complete a minimum of 12 hours of honors coursework – at least 6 at the 300-400 level. Graduates wear gold and black cords. **Achievement** requires a student to maintain a cumulative 3.5 GPA and 3 hours of IDIV 495. To qualify, students must apply no later than the beginning of senior year and have a strong recommendation from an instructor.

Alpha Mu Gamma - National Collegiate Foreign Language Honor Society. The cord colors are yellow.

Beta Beta Beta - Biology Honors Society. The cord colors are blood red (zoology) and leaf green (botany).

Psi Chi - International Honors Society for Psychology. The medallion colors are dark blue and platinum.

Pi Gamma Mu – International Honor Society in Social Sciences (Indiana Theta Chapter). The cord colors are white and royal blue.

Pi Sigma Alpha - National Political Science Honor Society. The medallion color is red.

Sigma Tau Delta - International English Honor Society. The cord colors are rich cardinal red and black. The medallion colors are red, black and white.

Honorary Degree Recipient



Richard “Dick” P. Teets Jr. was a co-founder of Steel Dynamics Inc. (SDI), based in Fort Wayne. At the time of his retirement in 2016, he was its executive vice president and president and chief operating officer of steel operations.

Teets worked with Keith Busse and Mark Millett at Nucor Steel in

Crawfordsville, Ind., from 1986 to 1993 and for J&L Steel (LTV Steel) from 1977 to 1986 in Pittsburgh, Penn.; Youngstown, Ohio; East Chicago, Ill.; and Cleveland, Ohio.

Decades ago, Nucor Corporation was recognized as North America’s leading long products steelmaker, using scrap-based electric arc furnace (EAF) steelmaking, and was determined to enter the flat products arena. Busse, Millett and Teets established the world’s first thin-slab casting process to produce flat-rolled steel in an EAF mill for Nucor Steel in Crawfordsville.

The three ventured out on their own to start SDI in 1993, building a high-production EAF flat-roll mill in Butler, Ind. They raised \$380 million in capital to build the mill, which began melting scrap for steel coils in 1996.

Under their watch, SDI became one of the largest and most diversified domestic steel producers and metals recyclers in the United States, with facilities throughout the U.S. and in Mexico, employing more than 12,000 individuals. Today, SDI is the third largest steelmaker in North America, producing more than 13 million tons of steel annually.

Over the years, the company also expanded vertically by starting a fabrication business known as New Millennium Building Systems and a scrap substitute business known as Iron Dynamics. Today, SDI is building a \$2 billion, first-in-the world aluminum mill that will recycle aluminum scrap into automotive and beverage can products. Each time the company expanded into a new business segment, a narrow focus on the bottom line was a key element of success.

Dick Teets was named Steel Advocate of the Year in 2016 by the American Metal Market magazine. He is a past president of the 10,000-member Association for Iron and Steel Technology and was chairman of the Steel Manufacturers Association.

He has been on the SDI Board of Directors since it went public in 1996 and is on the boards of Specialty Ceramic Products of Auburn, Ind., and Precision Wire Technologies of Fort Wayne.

Dick Teets’s entrepreneurial spirit and common-sense approach to operations have contributed greatly to Manchester University.

He was an active member of the Manchester Board of Trustees for 10 years, serving on the Governance, Institutional Vitality, Academic Affairs and Educational Quality committees. Before joining the board, he served on the President’s Leadership Council.

Dick lives in Butler with Lisa, his wife of 35 years, along with their son, Christopher. They have two grown daughters, Elizabeth and LeClaire, who both live in the Indianapolis area. He is a member of Holy Trinity Evangelical Lutheran Church in Harlan, Ind., and is a trustee of The Nature Conservancy Indiana Chapter.

Although many trustees are graduates of Manchester, Teets received his Bachelor of Science degree in mechanical engineering from Lafayette College in 1977 and his Master of Business Administration from Duquesne University in 1982. Teets was named the Distinguished Alumni of the Year of Lafayette in 2006 and of Duquesne in 2018.

His fresh perspective and naturally curious nature have been invaluable to the Manchester University Board of Trustees. For example, his connections helped the University bring in an outside consultant that helped Manchester navigate the construction process for the expansion in Fort Wayne, saving both time and money.

He is a generous collaborator who believes in shared success. Today we honor Dick Teets as a person of ability and conviction who leads a principled, productive and compassionate life that improves the human condition.
